

Extreme cuts to UConn Health mean



UNTREATED PATIENTS

UConn Health receives more than 1 million patient visits annually. These patients — including those on Medicaid, Medicare, and Managed Medicare — will lose their trusted providers.



CLOSED EMERGENCY ROOM

More than 33,000 emergency room visits annually means these patients will need to seek emergency care elsewhere.



DISPLACED STUDENTS

Nearly 600 dental and medical students will be without the sites for learning and clinical experiences vital to their education as the future providers of Connecticut's health care.



ELIMINATED DENTAL CARE

Access to UConn's dentists will be cut off for those who need it most, with students and residents unable to provide care at emergency clinics and community sites throughout Connecticut.



ABANDONED INNOVATION

Nearly \$77 million in grant-funded research will no longer fuel innovation, medical advances, and new cures for patients with life-threatening diseases.



DAMAGED ECONOMY

Closing UConn Health will evaporate the \$1.5 billion it pumps into the Connecticut economy each year in the form of jobs and life-changing research discoveries that bring revenue to the state.
