

## **An Extreme Cut to UConn Means:**

- An additional \$309 million on top of the \$142 million in cuts since 2010.
- At UConn, a cut of this magnitude would be equivalent to a reduction of 580 positions, 30% increase in in-state tuition, a cut of \$3,212 per undergraduate student and nearly half of UConn's financial aid.
- UConn Health would close, financial aid would be slashed, and thousands of jobs in the private economy would be lost.
- Regional campuses, home to more than 4,000 undergraduate students, would close.
- Drastic cuts to financial aid for our undergraduate students, 80% of whom are Connecticut residents.
- It will take decades for UConn to recover from a \$309 million budget cut.

## **UConn is critical to the success of Connecticut.**

- UConn generates nearly \$12 for every state-funded dollar.
- UConn supports and sustains more than 24,000 jobs, more than half in the private sector
- UConn contributes more than \$3.4 billion annually to the state's economy.
- UConn puts more than \$202 million in tax revenue into state and local coffers annually.
- UConn's research activities alone generate nearly \$375 million per year for the state economy.
